The Ethiopian Automotive Sector: Shifting Conditions and Next Policy Steps

Co-hosted by the Ministry of Industry, JICA and GDF

The GRIPS Development Forum (GDF) and the Japanese International Cooperation Agency (JICA) have studied and discussed Ethiopia's automotive industry with MOTI/MIDI (now MOI/ MTEIRDC), EIC, MOF, etc. We interviewed Japanese auto makers and their local partner firms in Japan, Ethiopia and third countries; MIDI officials were invited to Japan (Jun. 2018); and missions were sent to Kenya (Aug. 2018) and Myanmar (Dec. 2019) to examine their SKD/ CKD policies. Findings were reported in several policy notes and two MOTI seminars (Feb. 2019 and Feb. 2020).

Ethiopia recently curbed used car imports and revised the tax and tariff structure. The government is drafting the automotive policy with the support of GIZ/AAAM. Germany's VW showed interest in Ethiopia. On the Japanese side, Kaki now assembles Isuzu trucks and Suzuki imports entered the Ethiopian market. Toyota assembles cars in South Africa, Kenya, Egypt and Ghana but not Ethiopia. Mitsubishi re-entered Africa (Kenya) to assemble pickup trucks. Moreover, AfCFTA may affect the automotive industry in Africa, including Ethiopia.

In view of these developments, the seminar will discuss the current position and next policy steps of Ethiopia's automotive sector. The past studies of GDF and JICA, as well as analyses based on recent events, will be presented. This is a closed session for policymakers, development partners and invited automotive firms.
